**NARRATIVE**

About 2AM on Thursday, April 25, 2024, Boston Police Officers responded to an ongoing protest for Emerson College Students supporting a "Cease Fire in Palestine" at Boylston Street & Boylston Place.

Officers were aware from many social media and news media postings that there were numerous tents being erected on Boylston Place. One news article posted on April 22, 2024, by WBZ-TV quoted Emerson College student Owen Buxton as saying, "We're gathered here and we're not going to leave until our demands are met or we're dragged away by police".

With Superintendent Kozmiski (YC11) assigned as the Incident Commander and Captain Martin (AC01) assisting, Captain Martin spoke with protest organizers and explained to them that over the past several days (Since April 21, 2024) there had been at least a half dozen 911 calls for noise disturbances and protests at that location. Additionally, the A1 CSO Office had received a number of phone calls and 311 complaints (Case # 101005425124) for protesters blocking sidewalks, noise complaints at all hours of the day and night, and protesters harassing people as they walked on Boylston Street and Boylston Place. Police were informed that some of these protesters even went so far as demanding that members of the public identify themselves before allowing them to pass down the pedestrian alley walkway into the Massachusetts State Transportation Building (a rear entrance of 10 Park Plaza and important emergency egress). The Transportation Building is a public building owned by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the aforementioned alley provides access to employees, visitors, and members of the public who wish to enter and conduct business.

Additionally, Officers were aware that there were a number of tents erected on Boylston Place, in violation of the City of Boston's Encampment Ordinance (Ordinance 16-65).

Captain Martin explained to the protesters that the Boston Police Department supported their right to protest and that the police did not wish to make any arrests, but they needed to clear the sidewalk and walkway to allow people to pass without obstruction. Captain Martin's pleas to protesters to peacefully clear the walkway were met with loud chants from demonstrators using bullhorns. These bullhorns (loud amplification devices) were being utilized in a collegiate residential area at approximately 2AM. Sergeant Crossen read from the city ordinance verbatim over the police cruiser loudspeaker twice making it clear that the city was not going to permit the tents to remain erect and the protesters would be forced to take their tents down as directed by the ordinance. The ordinance Sergeant Crossen read stated the following:

*"On October 25, 2023, the City Council passed, and the Mayor signed, "An Ordinance Relating to Unlawful Camping on Public Property" ("Camping Ordinance" Section 16-65). The Camping Ordinance prohibits camping on public property under certain circumstances.*

*The ordinance prohibits any person from CAMPING or maintaining a CAMPSITE or CAMP MATERIALS in or on any public property or in the public right-of-way, including, but not limited to, any street, sidewalk, school or public park, unless specifically authorized or during a period when shelter is unavailable. If an individual accepts an offer of shelter space, the officer shall work with the Coordinated Response Team or available service provider to identify the location for placement. In the event that shelter space is unavailable, that will be communicated Citywide through the Bureau of Field Services."*

After Sergeant Crossen's broadcast, the protestors refused to move and take down their tents. In willful violation of the order, the protestors locked arms while seated and/or standing. Officers next inquired if the protestors wanted to leave the area or be subject to arrest. With an obvious police presence and despite numerous warnings, the protestors made no attempt to move from the line they had formed. Officers were then directed by Captain Martin to begin removing protestors and if warranted take them into custody. Officers were immediately met with passive, active and violent resistance as teams approached. Arrest teams proceeded to take suspects into custody who deliberately remained in the walkway. Officers coordinated with Emerson College to open the side doors of their building as a means of egress for staff and students who did not want to be arrested and wished to leave the area. During this process, Officers were able to ask many of the remaining protestors if they wanted to be arrested or wanted to leave the area. Many protestors expressed their desire to leave the walkway and were allowed to leave without being arrested. The protestors that remained were all taken into custody with the help of citywide Emergency Deployment Teams (EDT's), and the Massachusetts State Police. During this incident, Boston EMS and the Boston Fire Department staged on scene to assist with medical needs of protestors, bystanders, and officers.

After the Boston Police had successfully cleared and restored peace on Boylston Place, Emerson Police Chief Casagrande, arrived on scene and informed Captain Martin in the presence of Sergeant Downey and Officer Ciampa's that any person who returns to Boylston Place for the purpose of protest and encampment would be subject to arrest for trespassing. This conversation was captured on Officer Ciampa's department issued body worn camera.

After Boylston Place was cleared of prisoners and protestors, Officers were directed to inspect the tarps and tents that were set up, and debris strewn throughout the walkway area. Boston Public Works arrived later in the morning to remove all of the accumulated trash and debris to prevent unsafe/hazardous conditions for pedestrians and handicapped people from safely passing through the walkway.

During the time officers were attempting to control protestors and secure their wrists with flexi-cuffs, several unidentified protest participants began to push back and attempt to pull arrestees away from police. During these violent encounters, [REDACTED] sustained an injury to his left ankle/foot. He was transported from the scene by Boston EMS to Tufts Medical Center and was diagnosed with a broken ankle (See BPD Injury Report #242033086). [REDACTED] sustained injuries to his shoulder, left leg and elbow (See BPD Injury Report #242033084). [REDACTED] sustained an injury to his right hand. He was transported to Tufts Medical Center Hospital where he received 7 stitches. [REDACTED] sustained an injury to his right knee which caused pain/swelling. He was transported by Boston EMS to Tufts Medical Center for treatment. [REDACTED] sustained an injury to his right wrist while attempting to separate protestors who inter-locked their arms and actively resisted arrest.

Officer Chen in full hi-visibility Boston Police Bicycle Patrol Uniform observed a suspect (later identified as Willow CARRETERO CHAVEZ), standing with a bicycle on Boylston Street intentionally blocking a marked Boston Police prisoner transport vehicle from leaving the scene with arrestees. Officer Chen rode his police mountain bike closer to CARRETERO CHAVEZ and repeatedly directed him to move out of the street to allow the prisoner transport vehicle to leave. The suspect ignored Officer Chen's orders to move out of the street. When Officer Chen attempted to escort CARRETERO CHAVEZ out of the vehicles path by grasping onto the suspect's bicycle, CARRETERO CHAVEZ became violent and pulled back causing Officer Chen to fall from his police mountain bike and on top of the suspect's bike. CARRETERO CHAVEZ then began to grab his bike and drag Officer Chen who was attempting to stand up from the ground after being pulled down off his police mountain bike. After knocking down and dragging Officer Chen, the suspect then ran away. Officers engaged in a foot pursuit into the Boston Common near Charles Street. CARRETERO CHAVEZ was subsequently caught by police, placed into custody, and transported to A1 for booking.

There were 118 suspects arrested during this incident.

These individuals will be charged with Disturbing the Peace (MGL 272/53).
